Part-time position (15-20 hrs/week). Provides administrative support for our Kids Ministry. Includes curriculum, computer and social media support.



Meals on Wheels Ministry

Hello MPC Family! We wanted to update you on the Meals on Wheels ministry here at MPC.

As you may know, we have been serving up to 18 residents in the Mandarin area (32223 and 32257 zip codes) with a lunchtime meal Monday through Friday, at no cost to many of them. However, we recently faced a challenge when we were told that the cost of our meals from Westminster Woods retirement community would increase by 270% in September, which forced the ministry to seek alternatives for our clients.

After much consideration and several meetings, we have now partnered with Aging True, a federally funded non-profit that supports Meals on Wheels programs in Duval and Clay Counties.

Aging True has assessed all of our clients and our current cost share for meals is zero dollars. This gives us the flexibility to fund short term needs or provide holiday meals, something Aging True does not do.

This new partnership has been a huge blessing. Aging True also provides many senior assistance programs we've struggled to find services for such as financial, mental health and other needs.

They are an answer to prayer in many ways.

Mission Spotlight



Ron and Doris Weeks are missionaries with Redemption Works International (RWI). They are currently based in Mbandaka, Democratic Republic of Congo where the Equator intersects the Congo River. They work primarily with the congregations of remote, rural churches along the Congo River and its tributaries. Travel between churches often involves lengthy trips by dugout canoe.

RWI has three primary areas of ministry: Audio Bible distribution via The Proclaimer, Farming God's Way, and English Instruction.

The Proclaimer is a solar-powered audio New Testament that is provided in a variety of local languages and is given to those who can't read and to church workers, who organize listening groups.

Farming God's way is a tool that combines Biblical, Technological, and Management principles to empower the less fortunate to help themselves. RWI teaches Biblical stewardship of the land and faithful use of the limited resources. Farming God's Way leads to increased crop yields, which enables farmers to better feed their families and often results in excess produce that can be sold to provide much needed income.

Ron and Doris also provide English instruction in the area they serve. MPC is blessed to support Ron and Doris Weeks of Redemption Works International. <u>Watch Video Here!</u>
