Daily Bread Food Pantry Update

Into this new year, guest visitations to our Daily Bread Food Pantry and Clothes Closet remain vibrant after weekly guest visitations trended upwards throughout 2023. To recap: At year's end, our 75+ plus faithful volunteers have contributed to the weekly distribution of three grocery bags full of canned and packaged dry goods along with breads & pastries, fresh fruits & vegetables, and dairy products – occasionally some meat products!! Weekly distribution averaged just over 55 households (including>145 individuals) during 2023. Additionally, over 20 guests each week took advantage of various items from the Clothes Closet. We at MPC are genuinely blessed to be a blessing to those in our community who need food and clothing assistance.

MPC Meals on Wheels

Hello Church! It's been a minute since we've shared information with you about your Meals on Wheels ministry. It's been an eventful four months.

MPC supports a Meals on Wheels ministry that serves as many as 20 residents daily in the Mandarin area (32223 and 32257), for a lunchtime meal Monday through Friday. We currently serve 11 clients. The church has conducted this ministry for decades and purchased meals at a reasonable cost from Westminster Woods retirement community. In late August last year we learned our costs would increase 270 percent, which forced the ministry to seek alternatives. We found a fit in Aging True, a non-profit federally funded program to support the national Meals on Wheels ministry in Duval and Clay Counties. We transitioned to their food service and became a "drop site" October 1st.

We still use an army of volunteers to deliver the meals, a smile and some brief conversation in a routine that now takes less than two hours from start to finish. And yes, we are in need of a couple of new volunteer teams. Currently, the second Monday of every month is open. We begin the route at the MPC offices on Mandarin Road and most of our volunteers deliver just once a month. It's a great volunteer opportunity for retired couples. If you'd like to explore volunteering opportunities, please give the church office a call at 904-680-9944 and they will put you in contact with an MPC Meals on Wheels coordinator. Finally, please consider supporting this ministry with your prayers for our clients and the army of volunteers who serve them. Thank you.

Mission Spotlight: J1:9 Ministries

Mandarin Presbyterian Church supports a variety of missions around the world and locally.

The focus this month is J1:9 Ministries.

In 2015, a group of Jesus followers started J1:9 Ministries Foundation, Inc.. The genesis of J1:9 was fueled by a deep passion for missions in Central America and locally in North Florida. Three times, God tells Joshua to be 'Strong and Courageous, do not be afraid or discouraged'...Joshua 1:9. In Isaiah 6:8-9, Isaiah tells God, 'Here I am...send me!' and God responds, 'Go!' J1:9 circles in prayer these scriptures - asking our Lord Savior for strength and courage to be comfortable being uncomfortable, to have humble and servant's hearts, and to go when God says, "Go!"

The beginning years of J1:9 were filled with numerous mission trips and construction projects. After several years, J1:9 began expanding throughout Central America, where today, there are J1:9 projects in Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Guatemala, and beginning in 2024, El Salvador. In North Florida, J1:9 has partnered with local Churches and nonprofit organizations on various projects.


J1:9 completed the first Pastor Training facility in San Miguel Chicaj, Guatemala. This facility trains local Mayan Indians to become Pastors and share the Gospel in Mayan Villages throughout the northern region of Guatemala. The El Salvador project will be similar and serve remote areas of El Salvador. J1:9 provides all the funds to complete these projects, including wages for the local workers who face a severe shortage of work.

Most people likely recognize J1:9 for its world-famous Shrimp Boil fundraising event! J1:9 is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization that volunteers run with 100% of proceeds going to the Kingdom!
