# MPC MEALS ON WHEELS

Hello Church! I struggled this month to get a grip on what to say to you all about our Meals on Wheels ministry. We, like the Daily Bread Food Pantry, continue to see our numbers rise. We now serve 18 residents in the Mandarin area (32223 and 32257 zip codes) each day for a lunchtime meal Monday through Friday. And there doesn't appear to be a down turn in that need anytime soon.

As I enter my third year serving along side some of the most marvelous of volunteers for this ministry, I often find myself worrying about the dumbest things, aka finances. Even though our expenses for meals pale in comparison to what the Pantry spends each month, we still expend more than \$1000

each month, so there's that. God always provides and you, our wonderful congregation, always ensure we have enough, so I'll just try remember what Paul said in Philippians 4:6 and be anxious no more. Thanks for always providing.

One final note before I close. Please consider saying a prayer for our delivery volunteers from time to time. It takes roughly three hours to complete our tasks with Westminster and our clients each day and during those trips we encounter crazy drivers and, at times, some pretty heartbreaking circumstances with some of our clients. # **Update from the Daily Bread Food Pantry**

Guest visitation to the Food Pantry and Clothes Closet remains consistent. On average, we distribute approximately three grocery bags full of canned and packaged products, breads and pastries, fresh fruit and vegetables, and dairy products to 45 - 50 households per week (more than 120 individuals per week). Fifteen to twenty guests each week browse the Clothes Closet for clothes for work and play! We (MPC) are truly blessed to be a blessing to those in our community that need food and clothing assistance!

It may sound crazy, but one of our more pressing needs is paper grocery bags. If your shopping is packaged in paper sacks, save them and donate to us by placing in the marked Pantry bins at the Sanctuary or Church Offices. Any and all canned and packaged goods are terrific food donations, along with gently worn outerwear clothing articles (no shoes or undergarments, please).

Lastly, we appreciate and are grateful for your prayers for this ministry and our guests as we near our 10-year anniversary. God has truly shown his light on this ministry, and the love and support our congregant partners have consistently given

since our first day has enabled us to be a positive provisioner in our community. Praises!

## Sermon Series continues...

#### "Momentum"

In an article entitled "The Secret to Generating Momentum in Your Church," Carl Kuhn describes what it takes for us to gain momentum as a church.

Using the formula for momentum (momentum = mass x velocity), he articulates it this way: "If every person in our church (MASS) takes one step per week (SPEED) toward Jesus (DIRECTION), we have unbelievable momentum."

In the midst of all the other distractions in life, we want to spend this spring focusing our hearts and minds on Jesus and taking one step closer to Him every week. This sermon series will center on stories about Jesus from the Gospel of Matthew. My prayer is that in this series we would be drawn to the beauty and power of the Savior and hear His invitation to a deeper walk with Him.

This year is our 16th year of raising funds by selling mulch! We use these funds to support our overseas mission partners and send our high school students on summer mission trips. This summer we are going on two mission trips. We are sending a team of High School students to serve in Costa Rica and a team to serve in DeLand, Florida! In Costa Rica, they will be participating in ministry projects such as prayer walks, kid ministry, feeding centers, and more. In DeLand, they will be serving with local ministry organizations where they will be doing projects such as home repair, kids clubs, visiting seniors, and helping individuals with special needs.

We are excited to see God move this summer! Any money that is raised beyond the trip cost will go to our overseas partners to help with their ministry needs. Trips of this size are no small undertaking and we will again be selling mulch to offset the cost.

#### Disaster Relief ... Now What?

The trailer has been delivered, supplies have been delivered to multiple churches for multiple projects ... the question becomes, "Now what do we do?" It is very common that six months out from a disaster, the interest in the recovery wanes. Folks leading disaster recovery efforts find the six-month mark as a time when it becomes harder to get volunteers, tougher to complete projects, and the next tropical system seems just around the corner. Likely within the next six months, some areas of Florida will be dealing with another weather disaster!

At Mandarin Presbyterian, we made a commitment to collaborate with our brothers and sisters at Grace Church in Cape Coral, and the surrounding area. Our plans are to stay on course until one day, likely at least 18 months from now, the folks at Grace tell us their work is as complete as it can be. Regardless of what may happen somewhere else, we feel called to stay, and finish the work God tells us to complete!

#### So, what now? What do we do now?

Go for the full week, or take advantage of one of the short trip options – Sunday, March 5, return later in the day on March 8, or travel down on Thursday, March 9 and return on Sunday, March 12!
