Our second High School Missions group travelled to Costa Rica during July. The team consisted of 44 teens and leaders who travelled to the village of Horquetas to the Living Waters Ranch for the week, splitting up into three teams. Each team served in different areas of the community in and around the ranch. Activities included digging a trench on the ranch for plumbing, building a walkway through the ranch, serving kids through vacation Bible school, blessing families in the community with a week's worth of groceries, assisting in painting a new community center for 6:8 Ministries to serve the community, taking prayer walks and ending the day with team devotion time and free time in the river. Update from the Daily Bread Food Pantry



The summer temperatures are rising and so are the number of guests being served at the food pantry. We have seen a 30% increase year over year, as well as an uptick in the quantity of clothes being pulled from hangers

in the clothes closet. The Food Pantry has also seen more new guests on a weekly basis than usual, some of whom are coming to us from beyond the five zip code areas we serve. We do not turn anyone in need away; we serve them once, then help them to locate food pantry opportunities closer to where they live.

The offerings provided to our guests are intended to bring a little comfort to their lives and one less thing to worry about. The reality is that the gratitude and joy expressed by a guest when a car is loaded with well-rounded bags of dry goods, produce and bread brings as much satisfaction to the volunteers as the guests.

The increased demand for our food offering is putting a strain on the volume of food we try to maintain for prospective guests, but that is a good challenge to face. We have faith that God will provide, and it means we are able to share the glory and love of our Lord and Savior with more individuals and families. The Food Pantry would not be able to thrive without the continuing support of our covenant partners.

Recap: S.C.A.M.P. Week (Summer Camp at Mandarin Presbyterian)

In July, MPC held it's version of VBS, S.C.A.M.P. Approximatly 320 children, Pre-K through 5th grade, attended the week long activities. The week consisted of group activities and games outside, Bible lessons, crafts, music, snacks and water slides!

Our new Children's Ministry Director, Wendy Greer, shares a touching moment from her first season of being a part of S.C.A.M.P.:

"One of our Bible teachers was beginning to tell the story of Jesus' death and resurrection using an illustration with a candle and water tinted red. The teacher explained what each of the things on the table represented. The flame was sin. The red water was Jesus' blood. The 4&5 year olds were gathered around a table with wide eyes as she showed how the "blood" of Jesus would miraculously be pulled into the cup that held the candle and make the "sin" disappear. The Bible teacher was just beginning to explain what this illustration meant when a little girl at the table began to jump up and down in her seat. "Wait, wait, wait, wait," she said. "Jesus can take away all my sins?!?!" "Yes!" the teacher exclaimed!

In that moment, I gave thanks to our Lord God for each of you. Every one of you who sorted crafts, made decorations, planned snacks, or cut out craft armadillos. . . and all of you who prayed, played with children, or served on the team who worked security. Each of you had a hand in that little one who



understood the Gospel of Christ for the first time in her life! And for that little one and countless others who heard the truth from God's Word this week, I am grateful! God bless you for what you gave, knowing that our purpose was outside of ourselves. God used this church in a mighty way during S.C.A.M.P. and it was a great joy to watch.

S.C.A.M.P week raises money to support the Ukraine

Each year of SCAMP, funds are raised by the kids and donated to a charity or local non-profit supported by MPC. This year, SCAMP collected \$1,265.00 for the Samaritan Purse Project to benefit the children of Ukraine. This project donates full back-packs to Ukrainian children affected by the Ukraine/ Russia War.

The idea for this project was the brainchild of Chloe Barnett, a fourth grader at MPC. Chloe states that she got the idea after learning about the conflict from her school studies. Chloe brought the idea to Pastor Jenn and together they planned a competition between the boys and girls of SCAMP. The children earned money to fund the project. 
